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#### EASTER 2 — YEAR A

Jesus appears to his disciples and says to them, "Peace be with you." And they are glad when they see the Lord, Alleluia!

#### **Doubting Thomas**

Thomas, one of Jesus' disciples, has gained the nickname of 'Doubting Thomas' but really that is a bit unfair. Thomas wasn't present when Jesus first appeared to the disciples after his resurrection. Therefore Thomas is more of a sceptic than a doubter. After all, Thomas did not ask for a special revelation from Jesus. He simply asked for the same proof the other disciples had. Thomas was the kind of person, probably like us, who desired to know for himself, to see the

truth because he would not let others do his thinking for him. Jesus came to Thomas on his level., just as Jesus longs to know each of us where we are with all our own doubts and fears, questions and hopes. Jesus didn't tell Thomas off for his doubts, He didn't humiliate him. He could see that deep down in Thomas's heart, he really wanted to know God. Jesus came to him and told him to reach out to touch his hands and put it his hand into the hole in his side, the proof that he was Jesus who had died and was now alive again. Jesus said to Thomas, do not be unbelieving, but believing.

#### Jesus and Thomas - John 20:24-29

Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with the other disciples when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

#### What can we learn from Thomas?


It is very easy to be sceptical, and asking questions is not in itself a bad thing.

Looking for the truth is important and part of being a Christian, someone who walks by the truth. But it is hard to believe something just because someone says it is true.





You might be someone who is a bit sceptical. You could be a bit unsure of your faith and the truth is that we often have doubts. You may have a lot of questions. Deep down inside, you want to know God. You want to know for yourself. But the truth about Jesus is that he loves you and has something for you. He turns your scepticism into belief, your doubt into faith. So in prayer, come to Jesus with your questions. Come to Him with your doubts. Then like Thomas, you will be able to say, "My Lord and my God!"

Bible Story: Read John 20:19-31

#### **Jesus Appears to His Disciples**

19 It was late that Sunday evening, and the disciples were gathered together behind locked doors, because they were afraid of the Jewish authorities. Then Jesus came and stood among them. "Peace be with you," he said. 20 After saying this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy at seeing the Lord. 21 Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I send you." 22 Then he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. 23 If you forgive people's sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

#### **Jesus and Thomas**

24 One of the twelve disciples, Thomas (called the Twin), was not with them when Jesus came. 25 So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!" Thomas said to them, "Unless I see the scars of the nails in his hands and put my finger on those scars and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

26 A week later the disciples were together again indoors, and Thomas was with them. The doors were locked, but Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." 27 Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and look at my hands; then reach out your hand and put it in my side. Stop your doubting, and believe!"

- 28 Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!"
- 29 Jesus said to him, "Do you believe because you see me? How happy are those who believe without seeing me!"

#### The Purpose of This Book

30 In his disciples' presence Jesus performed many other miracles which are not written down in this book. 31 But these have been written in order that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through your faith in him you may have life.



#### What do you think about the story?







Suggested Readings: 1 John 1:1-7 John 21:1-13

Teaching Aim: To teach that Jesus' resurrection concerns us mow, in the present, because he shares his risen life with his people.


## **Suggested Teaching Outline**

- Jesus shares his new life with us. When did that new life flow linto us? — where do we find the Paschal Candle in church for most of the year? It was at the Font, in Holy Baptism, that Jesus begun to show his risen life with us. 4


## Something to make: A PASCHAL CANDLE

Required: Each child will need a toilet-roll centre, a piece of white paper, ROTHO COLOURED Scraps for the flame and a circle of card for the base.


around the toilet-roll centre, leaving pupper over at both ends. Glue the paper so that it remains wrapped Wrap the piece of white paper around the core.




2. At what will be the base of the candle, tuck the spare paper inside the core to make a neat base. At the top, give the spare paper a twist so that it




gluing on to the twist pieces of red and yellow crepe paper, foil, or coloured Make a flame for the candle by tissue paper.



# Thomas...saidto Him, My Lord and My God!<sup>99</sup> John 20:28

Thomas was one of Jesus' apostles. He was faithful to Jesus during his ministry but was afraid during and after the crucifixion. Following his resurrection Jesus appeared before all his disciples but Thomas, who was not there. When the other men told Thomas what they had seen he refused to believe it unless he could touch Jesus' wounds. Eight days later Jesus appeared again, this time inside a locked room, before Thomas. After seeing the wounds in his hand and side Thomas believed. Jesus pronounced a blessing on all those who would believe without having proof.
