We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart, as I embrace You as being already there and unite myself wholly to You; permit not that I should ever be separated from You. Amen.

POST COMMUNION PRAYER

The priest leads the prayer, to which we all respond: Amen.

We thank you, Lord, that you have fed us spiritually in this Holy Sacrament, united us with Christ, and given us a foretaste of the heavenly banquet prepared for all people. Amen.

An acclamation heralds the Gospel reading. If able, please STAND. When we say the Gospel acclamation:

Praise to you O Christ, King of eternal Glory!

When the Gospel acclamation is sung:

Praise to you O Christ our Saviour! Word of the Father, calling us to life. Son of God who leads us to freedom. Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*.

Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end of the reading: This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

HOMILY/SERMON/REFLECTION

(on Sundays and Principal Holy Days) Please SIT.

THE CREED (usually omitted at a weekday Eucharist)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation He came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

THE PEACE

The priest may introduce the Peace with a seasonal sentence, and then says:

The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

Let us verbally offer one another a sign of peace.

OFFERTORY (HYMN)

(The collection is usually gathered here - you may like to use an online method of donation instead, on our Facebook page or by PayPal on our church website: www.stmaryschurchthorpe.co.uk - thank you). The altar is prepared with the bread and wine, which the priest offers to God in thanksgiving and we reply:

All Blessed be God for ever.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

The priest praises God for his mighty acts in the preface (a seasonal prayer of thanksgiving). Then we say (sing):

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna (hosanna, hosanna) in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes, in the name of the Lord. Hosanna (hosanna, hosanna) in the highest.

The priest continues the prayer as we recall the Last Supper, when Jesus broke the bread, then we are invited to profess our faith;

Great is the mystery of faith: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

The Prayer continues to praise the Trinity (the doxology).

Amen. Or

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen.

Silence is kept, then the priest introduces the Lord's Prayer Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory,
