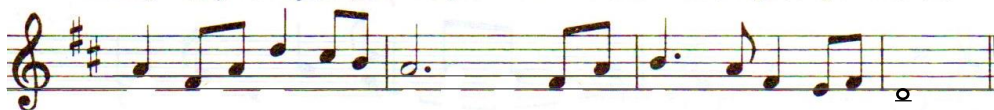

for ever and ever. Amen.**

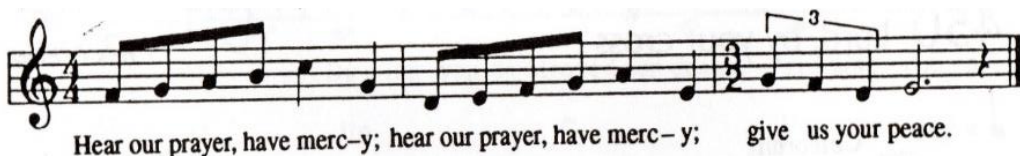
Breaking of the Bread
