The Holy Spirit - Alleluia!

(John 20: 19-23)

Pentecost Sunday - Year A - The Holy Spirit! (based on John 20:19–23, Acts 2)

It was evening on the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

... suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

It had been 10 days since Jesus had ascended into heaven and the disciples, known as apostles, followed the instructions they had been given by the Lord and were gathered in Jerusalem. (Jesus said, "But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you." John 14:26) On the same day there were many people from different countries gathered in Jerusalem also, because Jewish people were gathered to celebrate a feast called Pentecost. This special feast is a time where God's people brought gifts as offerings to God. (see Leviticus 23:15-21)

Other words for advocate are counsellor or teacher. The disciples trusted Jesus, that God the Holy Spirit would teach the believers how to live lives that please God the Father. As Christians read God's Word, we believe the Holy Spirit helps us to understand what we are reading. As we pray, we believe the Holy Spirit fills our hearts, our lives with God's very presence. Indeed, God speaks to us through the Spirit which leads us into all truth. At Pentecost, God kept His promise and sent the gift of the Holy Spirit upon those disciples, that they would be empowered to lead the church. The noise caused the people visiting Jerusalem to listen in and ask what was going on, because they couldn't understand how the disciples were able to speak in so many different languages. For each one of them could hear the believers from Galilee speaking their very own language. Likewise, the gift of the Holy Spirit helps Christians today to speak about God and Jesus and share faith with others. Let us pray for the gift of the Holy Spirit to renew our lives – our Church with God' blessing.



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
There are three words missing from this crossword.

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The missing words are	

- Make a very simple mobile of kites, balloons or sailing boats. Write 'Come, Holy Spirit' on some of them, or add some clouds and write 'Come, Holy Spirit' on the cloud shapes.
- Make paper windmills of varying sizes and colours.




On the Day of Pentecost fill the church with balloons. If you can get helium filled balloons they will move about in the hot air currents. If you can afford it, give everyone a helium filled balloon when they arrive at church. The balloons represent the Holy Spirit. At a given moment let go of the balloons. The Holy Spirit cannot move around among us if we hold onto it - we have to 'let go and let God'. During the singing of a 'Come, Holy Spirit' song blow bubbles across the church! And finally, ask everyone to come to church wearing red, yellow or orange flame-coloured clothes!

SEALING RINGS

(see Ephesians 1:13)

You will need:

Plasticine

Objects for pressing in designs

Wax candles and matches or sealing wax

- 1 Roll plasticine into a sausage shape, but thicker in the middle.
- 2 Bend round the ends to make a ring.
- 3 Flatten the thick part and press in a design.

To make a seal:

Take great care and make sure the children do too. Hot wax can burn.

- 1 Position a length of ribbon.
- 2 Drip on some sealing or candle wax.
- 3 Allow it to harden slightly.
- 4 Press the ring down not too hard and remove cleanly.
- 5 Allow wax to harden.

Get everyone to make first a ring with a symbol or letter to show that the thing sealed belongs to them. Give each child a card on which to draw a self-portrait, sign their name and add a ribbon and their seal. Seal symbols might include a flame, a cross or the first initial of the child's name. Have ready cards or posters with the words 'The Holy Spirit -God's way of saying, "You're mine" already written on them. Posters could have a long ribbon down one side and the whole group could add their seals.







NITE CULLAGE / PRAYER POSTER

Provide a number of different kite shapes for decoration then fix them all to a 'sky' background and attach real string or twine, perhaps with bunting. Write on a verse about the wind of the Spirit, or let people write their own prayers on the kites before adding them to the poster.

WINDMILLS

Use the template provided (or see page 38 in Here's One I Made Earlier) for a variation on this simple windmill. Photocopy one for each child. After colouring, cut out and along diagonal lines. Bend marked corners over to centre and fix with pin onto stick or strong drinking straw. Cover sharp end of pin with plasticine or similar.



Roll red and white paper or crêpe paper after making slits. Carefully tease out red and white ends. A4 paper 21cm x 30cm Fasten ends with glue or use an elastic band. Let each person who represents the wind have a streamer to shake as they move around making the sound of the wind.
